Competitions 1 and 2: AYD Horse and Pony 4 Year Old Championship Procedure

First Round:

- to be ridden two or three horses at a time in the arena
- the Ground Jury will consist of 3 FEI and EA accredited Young Horse judges who will sit together at E or B
- test will be the EA 4yr old Commanded Test (EA Dressage Rules 5.4.4)
- each horse will be awarded a mark for each of the requirements on the judging sheet and a final score calculated
- where possible there will be commentary for the public after each horse

Second Round:

- the top ten (10) placings (including equals) from the first round will go forward into the second round provided they have attained a score of no less than 6.5 (65%) in the first round
- the Ground Jury will consist of 3 FEI and EA accredited Young Horse judges who will sit together at C
- to be ridden one horse at a time
- the mark from the first round will not carry forward to the second round
- the mark from the second round will determine the Final placings for the Champion 4yr old Horse and Pony
- test to be ridden – EA Dressage Rule 5.4.4
4 yr old horses and ponies - Current FEI Dressage Test for 4yr olds

Competitions 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7: AYD Horse and Pony 5, 6 and 7 year old Championship Procedure

First Round

- to be ridden two horses at a time in the arena
- the Ground Jury will consist of 3 FEI and EA accredited Young Horse judges who will sit together at E or B
- test will be the EA YH commanded tests for 5 & 6 year olds (EA Dressage Rules 5.4.4)
- each horse will be awarded a mark for each of the requirements on the judging sheet and a final score calculated
- where possible there will be commentary for the public after each horse

Second Round

- the top ten (10) placings (including equals) from the first round will go forward into the second round provided they have attained a score of no less than 6.5 (65%) in the first round
- the Ground Jury will consist of 3 FEI and EA accredited Young Horse judges who will sit together at C
- to be ridden one horse at a time
- the mark from the first round will not carry forward to the second round
- AYDH final placings and National Age Group Champion are determined at the conclusion of the second round
The 5, 6 and 7 yo horses who win the second round are qualified to be selected to represent Australia at the annual World Championships for Young Horses (EA Dressage Rules 5.6)
- AYDP final placings and National Age Group Champion are determined at the conclusion of the second round
- Tests to be ridden – EA Dressage Rule 5.4.4
5 yr old horses and ponies- Current FEI Dressage Test for 5 year olds – Final
6 yr old horses – Current FEI Dressage Test for 6 year olds – Final
6 yr old ponies – EA Test for 6yr old Ponies (effective 1.8.14)
7 yr old Horses – Current FEI Young Horse Final Test 7-year-old

AYDH Champion of Champions:

The following will apply for the Champion of Champions prize:

- The P.S.I. Australian Young Dressage Horse Champion of Champions will be chosen from the winners of each age group. The guest rider will ride the three winners in front of the judges' panel and provide commentary after riding each horse. The judges, together with the guest rider, will determine the Champion of Champions

AYDP Champion of Champions:

The following will apply for the Pony Champion of Champions:

- The Australian Young Dressage Pony Champion of Champions will be chosen from the winners of each age group. The guest rider will ride the three winners in front of the judges' panel and provide commentary after riding each pony. The judges, together with the guest rider, will determine the Champion of Champions

Consolation Final (Art 5.5 EA Dressage Rules)

5.5 Consolation Finals

5.5.1 4 Year Old Horses and 4 Year Old Ponies

- the test to be ridden will be the current FEI Young Horse Test for 4 year olds
- horses and ponies that are not eligible to compete in the second round will be eligible to compete in the Consolation Final providing they have scored at least 6 (60%) in the First Round
- to be judged by 2 EA accredited Young Horse judges together sitting at C

5.5.1 5, 6 and 7 Year Old Horses and 5 and 6 Year Old Ponies

- horses/ponies that are not eligible to compete in the second round will be eligible to compete in the Consolation Final providing they have scored at least 6 (60%) in the first round
- to be judged by 2 EA accredited Young Horse judges sitting at C

Tests to be ridden will be as follows:

- 5YO YH/PONY Current FEI Dressage Test for 5 year olds – Final
- 6YOYH Current FEI Dressage Test for 6 year olds – Final
- 6YO PONY EA Young Pony test for 6 year olds (effective 1.8.14)
- 7YO Horse FEI YH Final Test for 7-year-old

Rosettes will be awarded to 6th place

Eligibility for the Australian Young Dressage Horse/Pony Championships:

As per EA Rule 5.4.3

- 4, 5 and 6 Year old horses/ponies must qualify by achieving at least 6.5 (65%) at a **YH Qualifying Competition** as per Section 5 in the EA Dressage Rule Book at the age group they are entering
- Horses/Ponies may begin to qualify for the 2017 Young Dressage Horse Australian Championships from the 1st August 2016 until the close of entries of the Australian YDH Championships (16th February 2017).
- Competitors are to submit on the entry form **two performances** in the above-mentioned competitions for eligibility as detailed above. If performances are at events with 2 rounds, the entry form must state in which round the score was achieved. Both scores from the 2 rounds will be accepted, providing different judges are used for each round. Judges names must be stated on entry form if these scores are used.
- Horses/ponies may qualify with one performance, however preference will be given to those with two performances
- To verify the performance, a copy of the test paper or result sheet **must** be submitted with the entry
- Competitors will be ranked from the highest average of the two performances to the lowest
- The competitions will be limited to 36 horses from each age group
- The highest ranked horses will determine the acceptance list of the top qualified 36 horses
- A reserve list in ranking order will be established
- In exceptional circumstances, the OC may request permission from the ADC to increase the number of entries per age group
- Imported horses that only have international qualifications may be accepted, provided proof of appropriate qualification in one or more overseas YH competitions accompanies the entry

General Conditions:

- * Competitions are conducted under EA National Dressage Rules (1 January 2016) and relative amendments.
- * All horses and ponies must be EA registered and hold a current Dressage Performance Card/ Competitor License
- * All riders and horse owners must be current financial members of EA
- * Reminder that all EA registered horses must have a microchip and will be randomly checked at the event
- * Riders must turn 12 years of age or over in the calendar year of competition
- * Horses must exceed 149cm with shoes or 148cm without shoes and ponies must **not** exceed 149cm with shoes or 148cm without shoes
- * All ponies must supply a current EA height certificate
- * In all FEI tests the trot is to be executed sitting unless specified rising
- * Tests may not be called except for the commanded tests in the first round
- * The birth dates for all horses will be as of 1st August
- * Competitions are official but do not attract grading points
- * The same judges will not necessarily officiate in all rounds
- * Horses and ponies will be judged on walk, trot, canter, rideability and overall impression as a future dressage horse, including standard of training on the basis of the Training Scale
- * The organising committee reserves the right to alter any competition/group sizes dependent upon entries

Dress and Saddlery:

- * Approved safety helmets are to be worn in all 4/5/6 year old competitions
- * A whip is permitted to be carried in the 4 year old age group (only) at the Australian Championships
- * A whip is **not** permitted to be carried in the 5 and 6 year old competitions at the Australian Championships
- * In the practice area, the use of one whip with a total maximum length of 120cm is allowed; for ponies the use of one whip with a total maximum length of 100cm is allowed. The whip must be dropped before entering the space around the competition arena or the rider will entail a penalty of 0.1 points from the total score
- * Pony riders, regardless of age, may only wear spurs that are no longer than 4.0cm. The length of the spur is measured from the boot to the tip of the spur.
- * Horses/ponies are to be ridden in a snaffle bridle as defined in Section 2 of the EA Dressage Rule Book
- * The minimum diameter of the mouthpiece of the snaffle bit must be at least:
 - 14mm for horses
 - 10mm for ponies

Please Note: Random measuring of bits will take place

- * The Mexican/Crossed noseband is not permitted
- * All other dress and saddlery requirements as per Section 2 of the EA Dressage Rule Book

Conditions

The CDI-W will be conducted in strict accordance with the current edition (including amendments) of: *FEI General Regulations; FEI Veterinary Regulations; FEI Dressage Rules; and FEI Rules for World Cup Dressage.*

The **Grand Prix** and **Grand Prix Freestyle** will be conducted under the FEI Dressage and World Cup rules. The Grand Prix serves as the qualifying competition for the Grand Prix Freestyle. The Grand Prix Freestyle will be limited to a maximum of 15 competitors. Participation will be determined by the results in the Grand Prix. Horses must have achieved a minimum score of at **least 60%** in the qualifying GP test to be eligible for the Freestyle.

- Horses must be **at least 8 years of age for Grand Prix** level and have a height at the withers exceeding 149 cm including shoes
- **CDI-W is open to riders** from the year in which they reach their **16th birthday**
- **Riders** may participate under the **jurisdiction of the country from which the rider holds their passport**
- Riders must take part in both the Grand Prix and Grand Prix Freestyle to be able to obtain World Rider Ranking points
- **Riders** may ride more than one horse in the Grand Prix and Grand Prix Freestyle
- **Once entered**, failure to start in the Freestyle to Music for reasons other than illness of horse or rider (Veterinary/Doctor verification will be required), results in the rider **losing his/her Grand Prix classification**
- Riders should be aware that the FEI considers any withdrawals without a valid excuse after the definite entry date as serious
- All horses entered in the CDI-W are subjected to a Horse Inspection
- FEI Horse Passports will be collected by the FEI Chief Steward at the time of the Veterinary Arrival inspection and retained by the OC for the duration of the event. All riders will be required to sign out on collection of the passport at the completion of the CDI-W
- All horses entered for a CDI-W must have a current FEI Passport or an FEI Recognition Card to accompany their EA Identification Document as a means of horse identification. ***Reminder that all EA registered horses must have a microchip and these may be randomly checked at the event (EA Directive 2011)***

- **EA Identification documents** are available from the EA National Office. Riders must ensure that they have the appropriate documents on arrival. Enquiries EA 02 8762 7777
- All riders and horses participating in FEI events (CDI-W) **must be registered on the FEI database**. Registrations must be renewed each calendar year. EA collects the charges on behalf of the FEI. Registration forms are available on the EA web site. www.equestrian.org.au or contact the National Office. Please note that this registration is required even if the horse has an FEI Passport or EA National Identification Document
- **Advertising and Publicity on competitors and horses** (Gen. Regs. Art. 136.1-2) the competitors are authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor on the saddle cloth in accordance with Art. 136.1-2. **Riders** with privately organised sponsorship may display a "logo" of their sponsor on their saddlecloth. The area covered by this logo **may not exceed 200 sq. cm. A sponsor's label on jackets must not exceed 80 sq. cm at the height of breast pockets**. Please note that if more than one sponsor logo is placed on the saddlecloth, **the area covered by all logos may not exceed 200 sq. cm as above**.
The Chief Steward will check that the advertising and publicity on competitors and horses complies with Article 13 of the General Regulations
- **CDI-W Whips:** At all international events, it is forbidden to carry a whip of any kind while competing in the arena. However, the use of one (1) whip, with a total maximum length of one meter and twenty (1.20m) in the practice arena is allowed. The whip must be dropped before entering the space around the competition arena or the athlete will be penalised. See article 430 of the FEI Dressage Rules
- **Ear Hoods:** are permitted for all Events and may also provide noise reduction, however ear hoods must not cover the horse's eyes and ear plugs are not permitted. The ear hoods should be discreet in colour and design. (FEI Dressage Rules Art 428.7.1) Logos on ear hoods are permitted - seventy five square centimetres (75 cm²) (FEI Gen Regs 2016 Art.135 2.3.1 (xi))
- **The draw for the CDI-W Grand Prix** (in groups of 5) shall be in reverse order of the World Dressage Ranking List. Riders who are not listed on the WDRL shall be drawn first
- **The draw for the CDI-W Grand Prix Freestyle** shall be in reverse order of placing in the Grand Prix (in groups of 5- i.e. a draw first within the group of athletes placed 11th -15th, then within the group placed 6th - 10th, and the last group of athletes placed 1st – 5th i.e. the best athlete/horse combination starts last). (Art. 425)
- **CDI-W competitors** please note the following closing dates: **Definite entries: 12th Feb 2018**. Unless we receive written notification from competitors beforehand, we will assume entries for the CDI-W are **confirmed as definite by the 12th Feb 2018**.

Eligibility:

- Performances gained between 15 February 2017 and 14 February 2018
- Horses must have a performance of 63% or above at two (2) separate Grand Prix competitions to be eligible for CDI-W.
- Horses will be accepted on performances as per National Championships – i.e. based on the average percentage of the 3 highest performances during the previous 12 months. Three performances accepted ahead of those who submit one or two performances.

If there is any conflict in the interpretation between the provisions of these Special Conditions and the Conditions of Entry, the Special Conditions will take precedence.

Organising Committee

12. The Organising Committee for the event is referred to in the Conditions of Entry. The Organising Committee may at its absolute discretion, decline to receive any entry or return any fee without being liable for any compensation: General Regulation, Article 116.11. The Organising Committee's decision in relation to any entry for the event shall be final and binding.

Cancellation and Refund

13. EV or the Organising Committee may cancel the event due to catastrophic conditions, disease or force majeure, or for any other reason at its absolute discretion.
14. If the event is cancelled after it has commenced there will be no refunds. If the event is cancelled prior to commencement the entrant may be entitled to a proportional refund of the entry fees paid. Any such refund will be determined at the absolute discretion of EV, having regard to the direct or fixed costs for the event.
15. Entrants who have provided with their entry an email address and/or mobile phone number will be notified of event cancellation by email and/or text message.
16. The refund policy for withdrawal, scratching or change of an entry is set out in the Conditions of Entry.

Release and Indemnity

17. You acknowledge that horse riding, working with or being around horses can be dangerous. Horses can act in sudden and unpredictable ways, especially if frightened or hurt. As a consequence, there is a real risk of damage to property, serious injury or even death. In consideration of acceptance of your entry and participation in the event you agree to release and forever discharge EA, EV, their servants and agents and the Organising Committee and each member thereof from all claims, proceedings or demands for any loss or damage howsoever arising from any accident or incident occurring at the event.
18. In consideration of acceptance of your entry and participation in the event, you agree to indemnify and keep indemnified EA, EV, their servants and agents and the Organising Committee and each member thereof against all claims, proceedings or demands brought by or on behalf of any participant or competitor named in your entry form for any loss or damage howsoever arising from any accident or incident occurring at the event.



FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) requires all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all those involved in equestrian sport to attain the highest possible levels of education in their areas of expertise relevant to the care and management of the competition horse.

Risk Management Conditions

1. Werribee Park National Equestrian Centre Committee of Management considers it a privilege that you are allowed to bring your dog to this venue. We insist you keep your dog under effective control at all times.
2. Approved Safety Helmets must be worn at all times when riding
3. Cross Country obstacles must not be jumped/used unless a non-riding level one coach is present.
4. Riding of horses bareback is prohibited
5. Riding of rugged and/or unbridled horses is prohibited
6. Any person may lead a maximum of two horses while mounted
7. Stallions must have an adult handler in the vicinity at all times
8. Horses are not permitted within/upon the quadrangle (between the barn & Indoor 1)
9. Horses are not permitted near pedestrian door ways
10. Bicycles are not permitted in the Indoor Arenas or any stable block. Approved helmets must be worn at all times
11. Bicycles are not permitted near doors designated as public entrances or exits
12. Motor Cyclist riders must wear approved safety helmets and hold the appropriate licence
13. Speed limits must be adhered to at all times, the speed limit at WPNEC is 10km p/h
14. Power leads must not be on the ground or over roadways
15. Construction of portable/tape yards is prohibited
16. Alcohol must not be consumed in the Indoor Arenas, unless purchased from the licensed bar located in Indoor Arena No 1
17. Please observe all signs at the venue
18. Horses must be tied in a safe manner. Horses must not be tied to unattached floats, wheelie bins etc
19. No infrastructure to be erected on WPNEC Grounds without written approval by management prior to event
20. Entry and Exit doors to Indoors Arenas are not be obstructed at any time
21. Every event to book at WPNEC must provide their own first aid officials

These conditions apply unless the Manager or the Committee of Management has given the discipline/event/activity concerned an exemption.

Exemptions must be applied for in writing and will be only valid for the dates granted.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Stabling

Stabling charges do not include bedding. Stabling charges: \$45.00 for the first night / \$37.00 for every additional night. All stables will be padlocked. Please report to the Stable Manager at the event office on arrival for access. Bedding can be purchased from WPNEC (03 9741 7672) . To ensure bedding is delivered to your stable before your arrival all bedding orders must be placed with WPNEC by Wednesday 15th March. Note: WPNEC compulsory cleaning fee \$30 per stable.

- All stabling requirements must be booked on the entry form
- Stables open at midday on Monday 19th March and must be vacated by Monday 26th March.
- Stables will be allocated in the following order of preference: 1. CDI horses, 2. Stallions, 3. Interstate horses, 4. Horses competing in multiple classes
- If bookings exceed stable availability, there will be a waiting list and competitors will be advised by email when a stable becomes available
- Temporary yards of any kind are NOT allowed. WPNEC yards are available for use.
- All horses entered in the CDI-W events must remain on the grounds from Thursday 22nd March until after the completion of the Grand Prix Freestyle on Saturday 24th March.
- Competitors must use the stable allocated by the Organising Committee for their horse/s
- Horses with behavioural problems in the stables—these MUST be outlined on the Stable Booking Form so that we can allocate stabling accordingly. This is a risk management and safety matter
- Any obvious empty stables are NOT TO BE USED as feed/tack rooms or for any horse for which stabling has not been booked
- No one is to enter the stable of another horse without the owners' permission and no one is to feed/water a horse that isn't theirs. If a person has concerns about another competitors horse or pony, they should go directly to the events office, Stable Manager or FEI Steward to report their concerns
- During the event, when cleaning stables, waste must be taken to the end of the aisles to the manure pits. Wheelbarrows will be supplied.
- A compulsory stable cleaning fee of \$30 per Stable is applicable and must be paid with entry.

CDI-W Stable Security:

- All horses entered in the CDI-W will be stabled together in the barn and subject to routine security checks
- ***Note**— Due to limited stables in the barn and many stallions attending this event riders in the CDI-W with multiple horses will NOT necessarily have their additional horses stabled in the barn with them however every effort will be made to accommodate all requests
- Daytime and overnight security will be in place and all access to the barn overnight must be logged in the official log book
- There will be one pass each provided to the rider, groom and owner to access the barn
- There will only be one entrance in and out of the barn in use over the course of the event

Horse Feed and Bedding

Horse feed is the responsibility of the competitor.

- Stable Bedding can be purchased from WPNEC (03 9741 7672). Competitors can order additional bedding during the event at the WPNEC office, but all orders need to be made before 4pm for same day delivery. Office is open 9am – 4pm Monday to Friday
- Horse feed can be ordered for delivery through Country Link Rural Supplies. Contact Ph: 03 5282 1280
- The only bedding permitted at WPNEC is shavings, you may bring your own.

Camping Facilities

- Powered sites must be booked and paid with entry and will be allocated by site number
- You must only occupy your own site – Powered sites are \$65 Unpowered \$40
- Day Visitors will be parking in K road parking area and will have no access to the camping area
